The Cause of Enslavement

It comes as a great surprise to many that in a Pew Research study last October, forty two percent of respondents in our country had a positive view of socialism. Respondents felt that it “Created a fairer, more generous system” and or “Builds upon and improves capitalism”.

That paragraph alone shows how many Americans have been indoctrinated into blindly accepting the cult-like revolution that is upon us. There is an entire generation that is unaware

of the dangers of communism. You might be surprised as to who is supporting it.

In the Pew Research study a majority of those who favor socialism were Democrats or those who identify as Democratic party leaners. Although a large majority of Republicans or those who are Republican leaning Independents do not look favorably upon the socialist way of life, some of those on the right clearly do have a favorable view of the anti-freedom philosophy.

For those who cherish Liberty and the Freedom, we may not understand how this could have happened. We have been busy working to provide a living for our families and staying out of others business while insisting that others stay out of ours. That is, after all, the core of Liberty.

Ignorance is only blissful until you realize that the unsinkable ship is mostly submerged. Now, as the ice-cold water of the deep abyss is starting to hit our feet, many are starting to wake up to

what is truly going on. As a student of history, I would like to share the steps that have happened over the last few decades that bring us to this point for those who may have missed it.

First, it is imperative to understand that the rebellious generation of the late sixties and early seventies became the professors and primary school teachers of today. They have had around two generations to instill Marxist immoralities into common everyday life while meeting little resistance. It did not happen overnight. Most sat by and did nothing or were not even aware that anything nefarious occurred.

As our populace lost its moral compass, so did the checks and balances against our political figures on both sides of the political aisle. We allowed our politicians to become dependent upon the dirty money of corporations that had grown too big to fail.

It is almost impossible for someone of any caliber to be elected without the key endorsements and financial support of mega corporations and the corrupt political establishments. These so called “donations” come with strings attached. The longer a politician is in office the more beholden to special interest they become.

The interests of the people have not been met or even truly considered in a long time. Politicians have a knack for telling us what we want to hear while promptly doing just the opposite. We have a short attention span when it comes to betrayal by those we elect to office. Politicians have come to rely on this for their infinite meal ticket at our expense.

This brings us to our next corruption of the Republic. Sound Money. in the Constitution, our Founding Fathers instructed that gold and silver coins are the only legal tender in the United States. In 1971 President Nixon closed the

gold window and opened the flood gates of corrupt fiat currency.

Gold and Silver were, and still are, a scarce commodity. They are a physical asset that cannot be created out of thin air and there is a finite supply. Fiscal discipline must be maintained to ensure that our Treasury and Government manage money responsibly.

The secondary conception of our original system is that the people did not part with gold and silver lightly. The Government did not have right or the power to take a citizen's earnings or wages until 1913 when the Sixteenth Amendment was enacted.

Incidentally, the Sixteenth Amendment was passed after Democrats led a successful public opinion campaign that taxation was needed to "soak the rich". Sound familiar?

Once sound money was replaced by printed currency the value of a rare physical asset was forgotten. People were

indoctrinated into establishing value in a currency, backed by the full faith and credit of the United States. This printed paper has value simply because people say it does. This was desirous to wealthy bankers because the private company called the Federal Reserve was given authority to print this currency and then loan it to the U.S. Government at premium interest rates.

We were told that there was something called inflation, which is the magic principal of things just increasing in value. In reality Inflation is the devaluation of the Dollar and what it has the power to buy. As our government borrowed more money against the citizens, they handed our subsidies and benefits to the common person to create the illusion of increased wealth. The value of the currency diminished while the perceived wealth was simply a metric of the amount of debt owed. People became drunk on the illusion of prosperity and they simply

stopped valuing the importance of holding their government to any degree of fiscal responsibility.

One last point that is important to note is that the Federal Reserve was created in the same year that the Sixteenth Amendment was enacted. This was important in establishing 1913 as the year when we started to leave a fiscally responsible path. The illegal closing of the gold window in 1971 just accelerated the train down the tracks toward the cliff. We could spend a whole issue on this topic, but we must move on.

Next, we must address the moral decay of our society and perhaps the most important step the Socialists have taken to undermine this Country.

Decades of the corrupt politicians, judges, bankers, and bureaucrats have led to a softening and ultimately a collapse of moral absolutes that were once the bastion of civil liberties in this country.

Citizens of good moral fiber voted time and again for people who championed life, liberty, and the pursuit of happiness on the campaign trail only to be disappointed when bills, laws, and judicial decrees stripped those same citizens of the rights they held dear to their hearts. Politicians are skillful in appearing to give something for nothing, while robbing you blind. This has gone on for a while as good folk are rarely riotous until it is almost too late for their voices to be heard.

It is now argued that an absolute wall between church and state must exist. Any avid student of American History knows that this was not the case in our early history. In fact, our Inalienable rights are based on common Christian fundamentals at the time.

Twenty-four of the fifty-six signers of the Declaration of Independence held seminary or Bible school degrees. They absolutely demanded that a man ought to have the right to worship

his Divine Creator how his conscience dictated. They knew that the only way a Constitutional Republic would survive is that if the Nation had a moral compass to guide it.

The right to exercise religion freely is enshrined in the First Amendment. It also protects the absolute right to express oneself by speech or writing and the right to peaceably assemble and petition their government. This is the first and most important amendment.

You may hear many of those without faith scream that there is no place for religion in government. There never was such an absolute barrier between church and state initially. Stephen Dinan and Alex Swoyer wrote an article in the Washington Times early this year titled “Founding fathers never discussed wall of separation between church and state”. This article is a good, but very brief history lesson for those wondering how we got here and don’t want to do in-depth

research on the matter. I find it preferable to read about what each Founding Father had to say about the matter, rather than focusing on a few prominent Founders.

Nevertheless, many of our initial values are mostly nonexistent as a Nation. Those with pride, ambition, and the godless, have stripped away the meaning and true intent of our foundation to suit their own desires. Those who still openly practice faith are persecuted. Communist movements Antifa and Black Lives Matter are burning churches, religious institutions and statues, while violently assaulting any who oppose them. There are more socialist movements than those two prominent ones, but they are too numerous to list.

These politically supported Marxist groups are openly seeking the destruction of our Republic. We face a situation where the rebels seeking to overthrow our Nation have the numbers, finances, and political

support to execute a tragic change upon this land which can only lead to the enslavement of the average citizen.

Their argument is that those who self-identify as socialists, collectivists, Marxists, and social democrats, are merely trying to create a Utopian society where all are treated equally. To propagate this narrative, they must eliminate all facts and opposition by force and intimidation. While they commit acts of aggression it is important for them to promise or make demands that may sound like common sense things on the surface but, are only empty promises that are the means to an end.

It sounds like a pretty package when you promise free food, free school, free housing, free drugs, free entertainment, free medical treatment, and free money. They claim this can be done when we give up our Liberty. The collectivists claim that common people are not responsible enough to have

freedom, while at the same time insisting that everyone be allowed to vote, even those who are not legal citizens. How many people do you know that have bought this scheme hook, line, and sinker? There have always been idiots, even in 1776. The solution back then was that voting was only to be done by responsible people.

The Marxists fail to understand that this fake equality of distribution comes at the expense of freedom. “free things” come at the expense of those who produce the most in this country. Without the ability to enjoy fair compensation for labor, the incentive to produce is eliminated and there is less for the masses to consume. In the Pamphlets ahead we will be addressing this more in-depth with the historical facts and appropriate context that allows the reader to understand this and draw their own conclusions based on sound reason and factual knowledge.

Our founding fathers had experienced the tyranny of corruption and oppression by a strong central government firsthand. As a result, they created our first government with a limited central government. That helped to prevent dominion by a few corrupt and ambitious individuals by retaining power on a local level.

Our first government was a Confederate Republic. It was enacted when the Articles of Confederation and Perpetual Union was our first constitution. It had to be ratified by each of the thirteen colonies and it took thirty-nine months to accomplish this. But on February 2nd, 1781 Maryland finally signed on and the United States of America was officially created.

The Articles of Confederation and our first form of government should be studied by any serious student of our Republic. By understanding it and the period it governed you can fully

appreciate what our founding fathers intended when they formed the Union.

Our Second Constitution was drafted on September 17th, 1787. Over a year and a half later after much contention and debate it was ratified on March 4th, 1789. It was created to secure and solidify the Inalienable rights declared in our Declaration of Independence while at the same time forming a more powerful central government that would be more effective than our first government. It changed our government into a Constitutional Republic.

The individual sovereignty of man secured on a local level and reinforced by a confederacy of common ground was just strong enough to secure Liberty and Natural Law. However, our country has always had a long-term memory problem. Ambitious politicians became frustrated with inefficiency in the Confederate Republic and states refusing to sign on to legislation

because of local sovereignty and customs.

Ultimately the federalists prevailed, and a new constitution was created. The Anti-Federalist movement was powerful enough to insist on our bill of rights to combat tyranny when it surfaced again. The problem is that many people are not aware of their unalienable rights secured in the Bill of Rights.

Our education system has been dominated by Marxists who have not taught the true history of our country. Two generations of young minds have been indoctrinated to believe that our Government is illegitimate and must be replaced by communism to protect the people. The new curriculum that they are teaching in schools is even more shocking.

The violent communist based Black Lives Matter company has been successful in distributing the new curriculum to our education systems throughout the nation this year. It is filled

with racism, anti-American, and anti-Christian doctrine that promotes communism. Glenn Beck, one of the few patriot radio show presenters left standing in this country recently got his hands-on hundreds of pages of that curriculum and what it teaches is shocking. If you have not started home schooling your children yet, then you should investigate this pervasive curriculum and start teaching your own kids.

Voices from the Past

There are roughly twenty-three thousand original documents from our founding fathers that have survived to this day. While that sounds like quite a lot. The Library of Congress says this is only ten percent of what they produced. We have access to these documents through the internet.

We will examine this library and convey the history of several people that you might recognize and others that you may not. Our goal is to bring you concise

articles from the past to help educate you about the divine benefits of Liberty.

Our first citation is from William Maclay. He was a United States Senator on a short term in the Senate. He was serving two years instead of the normal six because he lost a lottery to Pennsylvania Senator Robert Morris. This is an interesting story in of itself. Many things were different back then, including Senators being elected by State Legislatures and not by the people.

Senate business was not conducted in the open like it is today. Deliberations and business were conducted in secret behind closed doors. Although you could argue that this is the same today, only that a public show is put on to placate the people.

Senator Maclay kept a meticulous journal. If it were not for this journal and its insights, we would have little to no knowledge of what was

transpiring during the first two years of our new government.

William Macay, Patrick Henry, Samuel Adams, Thomas Jefferson, James Monroe and other Anti-Federalists were strong supporters of the Confederate Republic. They had some well-founded concerns about dissolving our first government and fought early in our second government to resist the tyranny of centralization.

This early group of Founding Fathers feared that a strong federal government would eventually become like the Monarchy and Parliament that they had just won a revolution against. Even though they were successful in ensuring that the Bill of Rights was included in our current constitution, they fought federalism wherever they could. They never gave up the fight for Natural Law, the sovereign individual, and his inalienable rights.

The Anti-Federalists Papers were written to persuade the

States to keep our original government and to not adopt the new constitution that was being proposed. These men believed that the new constitution gave too much power to the three branches of government and that eventually they would grow too powerful, out of control, and become unresponsive to the people's needs.

A common narrative of the Marxists of today is that the Founding Fathers and leaders of the time were wealthy slave owners who rebelled against the Crown out of selfishness. They use this narrative to attempt to invalidate everything they accomplished.

I encourage you to read through Senator Maclay's diary. This insight alone will help you understand that everything that socialists are trying to tell you is a complete fabrication without any basis on historical fact.

Here is a small segment of William Maclay's journal from January 5th, 1791. For context,

the Senate was addressing Centralization of Power. More specifically they were debating the creation of a National Bank which our devout senator did not support.

"I candidly confess I know not an exception among the present political figments of Pennsylvania. Avarice and ambition are the motives, while the cry of patriotism and the interest of the people are used as the ways and means of advancing their private ends. This peculiar malady is not peculiar to Pennsylvania. It is the disease of all popular governments. Nor does the fault seem to be in Nature. She certainly at all times produces stores of candid and ingenious characters; but these, generally modest and unassuming, are passed by in the ferment of popular elections, while the fiery and forward declaim on general grievances and pour forth their promises of redress. It is thus that ambitious men obtain the management of republics, and to this cause is,

perhaps, owing their fall and declension throughout the world, for no selfish, ambitious man ever was a patriot”.

This entry shows that even in our early days, the sons of liberty were actively engaged in fighting men of pride who served for reasons of their own ambition. We were blessed to have people who fought for liberty. I hope there still are people who will stand up for our divine rights. Surely, if we the people accept nothing less, than we will be in a better place.

Inalienable Rights

The term **unalienable** means absolute and unchallengeable. It is a deliberate, powerful word put in front of another powerful word, **rights**. In our Declaration of Independence, we declare that our Divine Creator gave us these rights. They exist naturally and no one has the authority to take them away.

These natural rights exist regardless of the laws of men. Every man, woman, and child,

regardless of race, class, or religion, have them. We have had them since the beginning of our existence, and we will have them until the end.

Natural Rights cannot be taken away and they cannot be transferred. They simply just exist. Even if you are vaguely aware of the Declaration of Independence you may wonder what these rights truly mean.

Stated simply and succinctly, all of us are created equal. No one is better than the other and none have dominion over another. We are exclusively responsible for our own affairs and we have no right to intervene in the affairs of another. We should not willingly shift the burden of our lives to another.

We are free to live our lives and the defense there of. No one has the authority to deny us our birth nor decide how or when we should die.

We are entitled to Liberty. That entails, but is not limited to, the ability to choose what a person

desires to do with their own life and how they wish to live it. We are free to be slothful and die in starvation, or work hard and obtain wealth.

Freedom to choose our religion without constraint and exercise religion throughout all aspects of our life, from the halls of our home to the streets of the city, and even in public service. Whether that be a religion of many, one, or none matters not as we are free to become subjects to serve our Deity in the manner in which he prescribes to our conscience. We have the right to think and speak freely without any constraints. We have the right to move freely within the nation or to another country.

We are free to pursue happiness which entails many rights including, but not limited to, the right to own private or sovereign property, the right to be safe and secure in one's home and on one's property, the right to work in whatever capacity one desires and to enjoy the fruits of one's

own labor without theft or robbery of said labors.

Now it is important to note a few things. The right for an individual to be their own sovereign or independent person implies that they have unlimited ability and unlimited potential. Most importantly, absolutely no person, group, entity, or government has the authority to infringe upon the rights of another.

So long as this simple tenet is followed there is no crime. Adversely anything less is a crime against humanity. No natural right grants authority over another individual or group.

The only role government is to secure the inalienable rights of which true liberty has an infinite amount of. There is an endless amount of choices one could make with their life.

As such there must be a mechanism to defend against those who seek to enslave a free people, both outside and inside the borders of one's own

country. Thus, the right to self-defense by whatever means necessary to secure freedom is paramount. It is certain that those who advocate limiting one's ability to defend themselves will also be found to promote subjugation in one form or another.

The promoters of subjugation come under the guise of the betterment of most, at the expense of an individual or the few. It is a dishonest and seductive argument. The slavers argue that the fruits of industrious labor should be free to be enjoyed by those who do not earn it. This sounds good to the lazy, the destitute, the irresponsible, and the selfish, but can only be accomplished through force or coercion.

Equal Creation

First, I would like to address any of the readers who are still stuck in political correctness and gender fixated world. Men, Man, Him, or whatever noun or pronoun used, represents all of

True Liberty means that anyone born into poverty or disability has the opportunity, through hard work and dedication, to become the wealthiest man in the world. Conversely, the wealthiest man in the world has the right to make bad decisions and lose it all.

Government's role is to protect the right of the individual to climb the ladder, while at the same time ensuring that if business makes bad decisions it will fail. Government's job is not to protect those individuals from their bad decisions, nor stand in the way of their good decisions. The young and uneducated who shirk their responsibilities should be pleading for government to get out of the way and stop bailing out slothful individuals and poorly managed businesses.

Some may gasp at this statement and feel it is too harsh. People need government to level the playing field to be successful against the ultra-wealthy. But if those same ultra-wealthy were not bailed out time and again then there would not be any of them. If the poor did not have massive regulation and bureaucracy, then we would be a nation of industrious small businesses and individuals that compete against each other for goods and services on equal grounds.

The Sixteenth Amendment should be repealed, the government should declare bankruptcy as it did in 1933, and we should return to our original form of government. Of course, that is just my take on it after lengthy study of our history.

The other argument that I hear is that we have evolved as a people. Let me cut that argument down right now. I believe Mark Twain said it best when he stated, "Don't go around saying the world owes you a living. The world owes you nothing. It was here first."

The world is a harsh place. It always was and always will be. This is by Divine design.

Whenever we attempt to take the harshness out of it for ourselves or our descendants, we are robbed of the learning experiences and wisdom that comes with those experiences. Do you really believe that a generation of handing out participation trophies while letting children stay at home in the basement playing videogames until they are thirty years-old has made us better as a country?

Those who say that we have evolved as a people claim our ancestors were not as smart or wise as us. They are quick to point to the computers and machines of our day, making life easier, faster, and more efficient. We can click a button on a device in our hand and all of the knowledge of the world is in front of our eyes.

Yet are we smarter, stronger, and better than our ancestors? How much of that information at our fingertips is lies, half-truths, propaganda, and smokescreen designed to manipulate us into

thinking a certain way. How many of us can discern truth from fiction? Are we just reacting to one advertised fear after another, causing our own enslavement? I argue that we have lost personal capacity due to the labor of machines and we are led to believe we are smarter.

For those of us old enough to remember just having a telephone mounted on a wall with a long cord to walk around and talk on, you might remember that you had the telephone numbers of all of your family, friends, and frequent business contacts embedded into your brain. You could recall them at any moment when needed, while multitasking effortlessly. Now that you have a smart phone and it does the remembering for you, how many numbers do you know now? How many facts about life can you recall before being forced to look things up?

In the day and age when we performed simple manual labor to live, had to make a fire to boil

water and then waited for our coffee to brew in order to enjoy it, we were stronger and more energetic. Today many require multiple quad shot espressos a day, combined with a few energy drinks, and they still lack the energy to get off the couch to load dishes into an automatic dishwasher or vacuum a floor with a machine. Does that mean we have evolved? I would argue that we have devolved.

Some will chalk that up to small sacrifices for more intelligence and greater marvelous structures that could not have been built in the past. Keep in mind that most of those structures will not last but a few decades before they will need to be torn down. Some have structural problems as soon as they are built.

The Great Pyramid is aligned almost perfectly north to $3/60^{\text{th}}$ of a degree of accuracy. Because the position of the north pole moves over time and the earth has a slight wobble, it was likely perfectly aligned when it was built. We would be stretched to

build something of that size today with that perfect of an alignment. The casing stones, of which there were 144,000, weigh approximately 30,000 pounds each. They are highly polished and flat to an accuracy of 1/100th of an inch, something we would struggle to produce in our modern day.

There are archaeological sites where smooth fitting stones weighing hundreds of tons cannot be replicated. There are countless sites and artifacts that confound scientists. Yet that is not the intent of this document. I merely point to examples where we were more advanced in the past. We have always been blessed with our divine intelligence and strength. When it is exercised and used regularly, and coupled with divine inspiration, we can truly accomplish wonderful things.

Duty to Liberty

Only after an individual understands the vast scope of Inalienable Rights can they

comprehend that there have always been lazy, selfish individuals who seize the liberties of others. Then you realize that the only way that socialists can achieve subjugation is to brainwash those in state of liberty into believing that they do not actually have, nor are allowed to have, true freedom.

The most common form of bondage throughout history is through the execution of fear. It is barbaric and yet effective due to the brain's primal nature. The primary shaper of fear has been through brute force. Although over the past few decades technology and innovation have made it much easier to lead people into a state of fear for reasons that do not exist.

It should be done by those who were old enough to make a sound decision, were responsible enough to make a decision that would affect the interests of their community as well as theirs, and they had cultural ties to the area where they were voting so that they understood the implications behind who they were voting for.

It was thought that a person of sound mind and a sense of obligation should choose those that govern. The states themselves decided who, in each respective territory, qualified as a person who possessed the necessary qualifications to vote.

Some states required a person to be born within its jurisdiction or to have been naturalized by time, before finally being granted the right to vote. In some areas citizens were required to live in

the state for twelve years or more before being allowed to vote. Early voters were often required to own property. The theory was that people would not vote for people that would not safeguard their right to property. The understanding that those who were poor or undisciplined enough to not make something of themselves would vote for anyone that promised them something without having to work hard for it.

The riotous collectivists that you see every night on the evening news cry loudly at how minorities have been disenfranchised in the past and only white men with property could vote in the beginning of our country and this somehow justifies their violence and vandalism.

The truth is not always what is bellowed by those who shriek the loudest. Often it is the soft-spoken man who generally speaks truth and reason.

Property was used as a designation of “citizenship” as

our country had no other form of Naturalization until we passed our first naturalization law in 1790, which then granted what we now refer as citizenship. It was not just black slaves that were excluded but white slaves as well. In addition, Indians, Mexicans, Irish, Catholics, Puritans, Jews, and many others were not given the right to vote initially.

It may be surprising to some that there were slaves of many races, creeds, and nationalities in the early days of our Nation. Briton shipped over three hundred thousand Irish, Quakers, Cavaliers, Puritans, Jesuits, and others from around their Empire who were all colors. This continued until 1775 and was one of the primary reasons leading up to the Declaration of Independence from England.

All but two of the original colonies wanted to abolish slavery outright in the Declaration of Independence. The need to be unified in all grievances against the crown

ensured that this did not make it in the final document.

That being said, voting varied wildly from state to state in our early years. States were free to govern their own affairs. Regional differences required different approaches to protect the sanctity of the vote.

Free white and black men could vote in New Jersey. Women could vote there as well. In Pennsylvania, Connecticut, and later Maryland, free white and black men could vote provided they owned property. Women had the right to vote sporadically in other states. Some religions were prohibited in voting as it was believed at the time that they could not grasp certain concepts of Natural Law or for other reasons.

If self-labeled social justice warriors were truly concerned with alienation of past classes and how disproportionately affected their ability to progress as a people was, we would see groups called “Jew Lives Matter” or

“Catholic Lives Matter”. The fact is that it does not fit the tall tale and smokescreen that they are trying to push.

Voting has changed often through our history. Sometimes people were disenfranchised in attempts to improve the quality of our Republic and sometimes through outright bigotry. The original concerns our Founding Fathers had over the uniformed voter falling victim to the bondage of cunning evil is still a valid concern to be aware of today.

From the Declaration of Independence

We hold these truths to be self-evident, that all men are created equal, that they are endowed by their Creator with certain unalienable Rights, that among these are Life, Liberty and the pursuit of Happiness.—That to secure these rights, Governments are instituted among Men, deriving their just powers from the consent of the governed, —That whenever any Form of Government becomes destructive of these ends, it is the Right of the People to alter or to abolish it, and to institute new Government, laying its foundation on such principles and organizing its powers in such form, as to them shall seem most likely to affect their Safety and Happiness. Prudence, indeed, will dictate that Governments long established should not be changed for light and transient causes; and accordingly all experience hath shewn, that mankind are more disposed to suffer, while evils are sufferable, than to right themselves by abolishing the forms to which they are accustomed. But when a long train of abuses and usurpations, pursuing invariably the same Object evinces a design to reduce them under absolute Despotism, it is their right, it is their duty, to throw off such Government, and to provide new Guards for their future security.—Such has been the patient sufferance of these Colonies; and such is now the necessity which constrains them to alter their former Systems of Government. The history of the present King of Great Britain is a history of repeated injuries and usurpations, all having in direct object the establishment of an absolute Tyranny over these States. To prove this, let Facts be submitted to a candid world.
