#### LIBERTY RED

## MY MOTHER THE WELDER

What do you get when you combine a force of nature, the human Spirit and a group of patriotic people together? You get all the women who came together during World War II to help save the country, commonly called Rosie the Riveter. Most of you have seen the old posters of a young woman with her sleeves rolled up, a bandana on her head, and her right arm curled up showing her muscle. Well, let me introduce you to my mother. She was not Rosie the Riveter; she was my mother the welder. She went to work for a steel company welding bomb casings. I managed to talk with her about it before she passed away. I also received more information from my older brother.

When the men went to war, it left a huge void in manufacturing jobs. Many of the factories switched over to production for the war effort. Here is just a small portion of what the women were required to do: Take care of their children, pay the bills, do the upkeep on the house, keep

the car running, cook the meals, do the shopping, and do without most modern conveniences that many women take for granted today - all while going to work for up to 12 hour days while being able to work different shifts. I have probably missed a few things so my apology to those who were affected by the war.

My mother told me that most everyone was on some sort of food rationing and little was to be had for any other items like nylons, make up, or toys for the Milk was unavailable kids. unless you received powdered milk in the food boxes you got from the government. clothes were almost nonexistent, so you patched what you had then patched the patches. The kids usually got patched up hand-So how did these me-downs. ladies do it?

Women banded together and helped each other out. Those who could not work, watched the kids of those who were at work. They made homemade toys for the kids. You have to keep in mind that there were no TV's, cell phones, or video games. About the only thing left was the

radio. Children were taught to use their imagination when playing. They were taught to have respect for and to get along with each other. If they could not do that, they received the board of education across their butt. This taught them that they were held accountable for their actions. This is something that is sorely missed today.

My mother carried out her frugality even after the war. She passed this onto us, her sons. My brother and I are the baby boomers that were taught what respect was, what a patriot is, and to honor God, the flag, and our country. My mom and dad taught us kids how to build a better country. But something went terribly wrong. The next several generations started to turn against what we were taught. My mother and all the other women who helped shape this country during the second world war and afterward are probably turning over in their graves in anguish seeing what this nation has become. Maybe that board of education should have been

applied more liberally to our kids.

To all the women who helped save our nation through sacrifice and hard work, along with our fathers that went to war, I salute and honor you for being one of the greatest of generations and to have passed your wisdom on to us.

Diary of Anna Green Winslow: A Boston School Girl of 1771 by Alice Morse Earle

Contrary to what one might assume, spinning was a lost art prior to the war - at least for the "leisure" class. British oppression prompted many ladies to pull spinning wheels from the attic, dust them off and put them to work. Classes were offered, demonstrations held, and bees hosted. Spinning schools opened in Boston. Even

wearing a homespun gown was a passive form of rebellion.

"most agreeably manifested in the dress of the Ladies on this occasion, who, to the number of near one hundred, appeared in homespun gowns; a lively and striking instance of their acquiescence and concurrence in whatever may be the true and essential interest of their country. It were to be wished that all assembles of American Ladies would exhibit a like example of public virtue and private economy, so amiably united."

"Williamsburgh, (in Virginia) January 3," *Boston Gazette* (Boston: February 12, 1770)

Not all spinners were part of the uprising. Some women who took part in spinning did not participate as a stand against the Crown, but as a charity for the downtrodden. The boycott of British goods put a unique burden on the poor, sick and widowed. Spinning was a form of service, not just a political statement.

Going into the Revolutionary War. the spinning wheel provided active women participation in political society, while maintaining their female virtue within the confines of the household sphere. Leveraging domestic power, their planned events and made calculated purchasing choices for the cause of liberty. The legacy of these "spinsters", female spinners of thread, continues today as the Daughters of the Revolution...the American organization symbolized as the cherished spinning wheel.

## PENOLOPE BAKER EDENTON TEA PARTY

Mainstream historians have been eerily silent when it comes to the Daughters of Liberty. These historians would have one believe that we, the fairer sex, have spent the last two centuries bound to the hearth by our apron strings. This is far from the case. Strong, brilliant, independent women have continually put their mark on this great nation, doing their part to fight for our inalienable rights.

Ten months after the Boston Tea Party, Penelope Barker organized the famous Edenton Tea Party, the first recorded women's political demonstration in America - in fact, in western history.

"Maybe it has only been men who have protested the King up to now. That only means we women have taken too long to let our voices be heard."

Fifty-one women, from surrounding North Carolina

towns and farms, gathered at the home of Elizabeth King, forming the Edenton Ladies Patriotic Guild. Together they drafted and signed an agreement to boycott all British goods as they drank tea made from mulberry leaves, lavender, and other local herbs.

"We the aforesaid Ladys will not promote ye wear of any manufacture from England until such time that all acts which tend to enslave our Native country shall be repealed."

Unlike the men's Boston Tea Party, the Edenton ladies did not believe in hiding. They made their statement in plain view, signing their real names to their proclamation.

"We are signing our names to a document not hiding ourselves behind costumes like the men in Boston did at their tea party.
The British will know who we are."

Their names published in local and London newspapers; King

George could not ignore the Edenton ladies. The media attacked their reputations, portraying them as bad mothers and loose women. Like their Boston counterparts, these Southern Daughters of Liberty were willing to sacrifice all - their lives, fortunes, and honor, for the cause of freedom.

History has a habit of repeating itself. What are you willing to sacrifice to preserve the system of government we hold dear? Are our God-given inalienable rights worth protecting or are you "security" the content with oppression brings? For the sake children of our and grandchildren, I would argue that it is time for the ladies to speak up and step out just as Penelope Barker did in 1774. Our constitutional republic hangs in the balance. It is up to us to sway the balance in favor of liberty.

## THIS MONTH IN HISTORY

Early in the Revolutionary War the Colonials quickly built a fleet to defend Lake Champlain and prevent the British from using the lake as an invasion point into the Colonies. While General Benedict Arnold lost the battle on October 11th, 1776 and most of the ships were destroyed or captured. the battle was successful in delaying the British from their advance on the upper Hudson River valley.

The Battle of Pell's point was one of the most significant battles of the Revolutionary War and is seldom talked about in history. It happened on October 18th, 1776 and had we lost it, General George Washington and the main force making up the Continental Army would have been trapped on the island of Manhattan.

On October 26<sup>th</sup> of 1776, Benjamin Franklin departed for France exactly one month after he was named Ambassador to France. The trip took a month for the seventy-year-old ambassador to complete and would be instrumental in securing a treaty with France.

The Battle of White Plains on October 28th, 1776 ultimately ended in defeat for General George Washington and the Continental Army. The battle did buy time for the battered colonials who were able to evacuate some of their supplies ahead of the orderly retreat of General Washington into New Jersey.

On October, 31st, King George addressed the British Ш Parliament for the first time concerning the Declaration of Independence the and Revolutionary Leaders who signed it. The King was quick to point out the humiliating defeat of the Continental Army in the Battle of Long Island in August of that year, but also clearly prepared Parliament for another campaign against the Americans and acknowledged that all was not going well for Britain.

Future editions of "This Month in History" will show the timeline starting in October of 1776 and will advance a month in each issue. We hope this snapshot of the Revolutionary War inspires you to read more about the period we cover. The Further Reading section towards the back of The Pamphlet will contain some pointers on where you can find more information on some events.

#### NATURAL LAW

"The unanimous Declaration of the thirteen united States of America. When in the Course of human events. it becomes necessary for one people to dissolve the political bands which have connected them another, and to assume among the powers of the earth, the separate and equal station to which the Laws of Nature and of Nature's God entitle them, a decent respect to the opinions of mankind requires that they should declare the causes which impel them to the separation.

We hold these truths to be selfevident, that all men are created equal, that they are endowed by their Creator with certain unalienable Rights, that among these are Life, Liberty and the pursuit of Happiness.-That to secure these rights, Governments instituted among Men. deriving their just powers from the consent of the governed, --That whenever any Form of Government becomes destructive of these ends, it is the Right of the People to alter or to abolish it, and to institute new laving Government. foundation on such principles and organizing its powers in such form, as to them shall seem most likely to effect their Safety and Happiness. Prudence, indeed, will dictate that Governments long established should not be changed for light and transient causes: and accordingly all experience hath shewn, that mankind are more disposed to suffer, while evils are sufferable, than to right themselves by abolishing the forms to which they are accustomed. But when a of abuses long train and usurpations, pursuing invariably

the same Object evinces a design to reduce them under absolute Despotism, it is their right, it is their duty, to throw off such Government, and to provide new Guards for their future security."

The above section of the Declaration of Independence is only about a quarter of the transcription. The rest of the Declaration of Independence goes into some specific British grievances that the Empire had committed against the colonists in America. We will not be addressing those sections in this issue but will instead focus on unalienable rights.

This founding document of the inhabitants of the United States of America, is the single most important document in our history. It defines who we are as a nation. It states clearly that we adhere to the Laws of Nature and that God bestows or entitles us to this law.

What is this Natural Law? Aristotle (384 - 322 BC) had

learned about the rudimentary ideas of Natural Law while studying in Plato's Academy for twenty years before forming his own academy. His observation of Greeks in their city-states helped him expand the understanding of Nature's Law and he is considered by many to be the father of Natural Law. His observations are critical to the evolution of the entire western civilized world.

Aristotle defined justice into two spheres. There was justice of nature, which is the higher justice of our creator, and then there was the justice of law which was defined by men. When the laws of men encroached on Natural Law then man had the right to appeal to the higher law of nature which trumped the lower laws of men.

I understand that this is a simplification of Aristotle's observations, but there is a need to put it even more plainly for the purposes of this article.

When a government oppresses people's basic human rights then those people have a right and a responsibility that is afforded to them by their creator to throw off that government and form a new one, so long as that one respects basic human rights. Men are provided this through Providence. Which is Divine power guiding human destiny.

What our founders did in the first paragraph of the Declaration was to invoke Natural Law to secure their basic rights. second paragraph continues to expand on this by stating some understandings basic of individual sovereignty. We are all created as equal human beings. We are all entitled to liberty, which is another word for autonomy or self-rule. We are all entitled to the pursuit of happiness. This means we can all enjoy the fruits of our own labor in the way we desire without being hindered in our quest or risk having our profits stolen through taxation, theft, or piracy.

We are further reminded that governments only function is to secure these rights and that their existence and authority comes explicitly from the consent of the governed. Should a government become destructive to our natural rights then it is the right of the people to abolish said government and form another that secures those rights.

Our declaration then takes an interesting turn, talking about Prudence or caution. Stating that the longer a government has been in place the more evidence is needed to present your case to the powers that be. That light or temporary causes do not qualify for overthrowing a government. But if a "long train of abuses and usurpations" happen resulting in "Absolute Despotism" then it is our right and our duty to throw off such Government.

For those who state that our Declaration of Independence was an old thought process from people in the 1700's who did not understand modern times. Keep in mind that our unalienable

rights were further defined in the Universal Declaration of Human Rights signed in 1948 by the United Nations. This act extended our understanding of Natural Law to our entire planet and has never been rescinded

What socialists, Marxists, communists, collectivists, and even anarchists are attempting to do is roll back thousands of years of human progression and return us to absolute despotism.

We must defend the absolute rights afforded us by our Creator and outlined in our Declaration of Independence or risk losing our Liberty.

### HARVEST SEASON

work the land into overdrive. There is not much time to get the last of our wood in to keep us warm and there is not much time to finish out the harvest and prepare our livestock for winter.

What we have not done by the end of the month to prepare for the long winter ahead, simply will not get done. This applies to our farms as well as our families. Make no mistake, this winter will be unlike any we have ever gone through.

As we speak there are upwards of a hundred cities in this nation that are preparing for civil war. Communist organizations Antifa and Black Lives Matter Inc. have teamed up with anarchists and scores of other hate groups. They are supported by the Socialist Party of America, Democratic Party, Open Society Foundations, ActBlue, and numerous others.

Those with their heads in the sand will soon come. If the current civility levels in our cities is any indication, they are not likely to ask nicely for your stuff.

You may or may not have noticed, but it has become

difficult to buy ammunition in any decent quantity and guns have been flying off the shelves in recent months. That means a few things. First, there are plenty of people out there who are just starting to realize that they are going to have to fend for themselves and are not prepared. Second, there are going to be a whole lot of people out there with guns who are likely to do bad things when thev get desperate enough.

Now is probably the last call to buff up your armory to ensure that you can not only defend yourself, but hunt for food. Keep in mind that certain things are almost completely sold out. Get what you can if you have nothing. Above all, be prudent with the resources that you have. Come up with a list of everything you need and prioritize it so that you can get the most important things first.

Lastly, a little advice for those who are new to the rural communities after having escaped the chaos of the cities. The people out here are a resilient stock who are used to the long cold winters that we normally deal with. We have wolves, dealt with bears. mountain lions, and plenty of nutjobs from the city who think they can move up here and change things. You have probably noticed that you cannot get a cell phone signal in most parts of the county. You can expect power outages and internet outages quite frequently especially in the winter. Quite a few of the locals communicate via Amateur Radio. If you are looking for a free class email me and I will forward your contact information to a local teacher. There is also CB and FRS radio. although those are not as effective for getting help if you need it. Landlines are a must. Even when service goes out to the outside world, they still work locally and you can make a phone call in the dark if you have an older model that does not require power.

Yes, it seems like this is the land that time left behind. We like it that way. The challenges of living a hard life keep the riff raff out. When you go to the dump and try to pay with a visa card you will be politely informed, "We don't use them fancy things around here". That is just how it is. Some places will accept cards, but if you pay cash you may get a discount. Local checks are usually still accepted in most places for those of you that know what a checkbook is.

We are a decent people who know how to shoot straight and look after our own. If you are of good stock and are likeminded, then you will probably survive out here. If you are not prepared and not willing to endure the feet of snow and twenty below, you most likely will not survive. It's a good place to live. Just don't go and try changing it to the place that you left behind.


