NULLIFICATION

Understanding ‘*The Right of Nullification*’, requires the understanding of our natural rights which our Founding Fathers referred to as unalienable or inalienable rights. Both spellings are correct. Natural rights come from our Divine Creator. Some refer to Him as God, others say He is The Great Spirit. Regardless of your conviction or lack thereof, there are certain rights that you are entitled to as a human being.

The United States established protections for these human entitlements in our Bill of Rights. We are also a nation that has become one of 173 that have signed and ratified the International Covenant on Civil and Political Rights. However, no matter how official we make it, government has a certain trajectory towards corruption and oppression of the people.

What government forgets is that it is a creature that is created by and for the people. Its control is derived only by the will of the people. When people stop

believing in the control of government then that government will fail. It can maintain the illusion of control, for a limited time, through oppression. Ultimately the people reclaim their power. This is where nullification kicks in.

When a state determines that a federal law is unconstitutional it can declare it null and void within the sovereign boundaries of the state. This happened in the nullification crisis of 1832-33. The crisis was avoided when both sides agreed to a compromise bill. It is important to note here that both the federal government and South Carolina were preparing for a conflict if it came to that. I do not think many governors today have the stones to back up the will of the people with a proper constitutional militia. With the individual states all but neutered, all faith rests with the inalienable right of nullification.

This right can be described as civil disobedience, but I do not believe that term accurately reflects nullification. The constitutionality of a law that orders a person to do or not to do something is critical to

knowing whether to invoke nullification. As keepers of the Constitution, 'We the People', are obliged to disobey anything that is contrary to it. The same inalienable right extends to state constitutions as well. Whenever government at any level exceeds the boundaries that are set upon it then we not only have the right, but the obligation to act.

Critical to this is knowing your governing documents. In my case that is the Constitution of the United States of America and the Constitution of the State of Washington. When enough patriotic Americans stand up and nullify unconstitutional mandates, laws, and court rulings, then true change will start to happen.

There are provisions in this life to right the wrongs of society. Sadly, most of us have advocated our responsibilities as mechanics in our government. It is not too late to stand now for liberty. Inalienable means that these natural rights don't expire, and they don't need permission to exercise. It is critical to exercise your rights after logical

reason based on careful reflection of the facts. With these rights come the responsibility to seek enough information to reach an educated conclusion. Emotional outbursts without sound logical reasoning are unlikely to lead to justification.

If you would like to learn more, I recommend reading what James Madison has to say on nullification. The Federalist Papers as well as the Anti Federalist Papers are essential to understanding the limits of government outlined in the Constitution.

CONVENTION OF STATES

I have heard quite a few people talk about the convention of states mentioned in Article V, of the Constitution. That Article allows a convention of states to be convened which has the power to change or replace the constitution. There are a growing chorus of well-meaning Americans who repeat the same arguments that have been debated throughout our nation's history.

A Convention of States is a complicated subject. It would take a full issue to cover all sides fairly. For the sake of brevity, I could not adequately cover it here. It has never been done before. Many have attempted to get the support for a convention, even right after it was signed when the Anti-

Federalists tried to invoke Article V shortly after our new constitution was adopted. Groups even now are attempting to gather support for a convention.

Advocates that speak against a Convention of States, argue that if we would enforce the constitution that we have there would be no need to change it. There may be some truth to that line of thinking. There is no allowance in the constitution for the reach, power, and invasiveness that our government has morphed into.

A careful examination of the unconstitutional overreach by federal, state, and local officials over the past year verifies that an unchecked government is in charge. But who do you think would attend and decide on how the constitution was to be changed? The same political faces we have seen for years. I don't trust people in charge to do the right thing. We would most likely have Mitch McConnell, Mitt Romney, Chucky Schumer, and Nancy Pelosi running the whole show.

A Convention of States would ensure that the corrupt elite that pull the strings could essentially be granted prime decision seats at the convention. It could be the doorway that abolishes our constitution completely, and our third government could be formed. That would be like what happened early in our nation's history and why we are on our second government. Once you open the Pandoras Box of a government body of politicians tinkering with the Constitution, there is no telling what will happen.

Advocates for the convention state that reasonable and honorable men were able to prevail and that we would be able to control who is a delegate and narrow the scope of what a delegate could do. Both arguments are completely without merit as far as I can see. There is nothing safe about tinkering with the Constitution.

It is a failsafe switch, built into our Constitution to enable the States to change the Constitution. The question that many must have on their mind is if they would trust

anyone with the morals of today to be able to craft a government that would more perfectly preserve the unalienable rights of mankind. But does it work, or could it hope to work in this age where government and society are plagued with pieces of Marxism, Anarchy, and Oligarchy?

Those in opposition believe that if we stick to the constitution and **ENFORCE IT** the Federal Government has limited power. Strong opponents such as Joanna Martin "Publius Huldah" are advocating that we need to keep the constitution and roll back power of government. Another argument is that people are ignoring constitution.

State governments have been bribed with printed money to go along with any unconstitutional "laws". The many states are addicted to the annual federal dollars and would not be able to financially survive without it. There is no pushback built into the system anymore. In order for States to be able to reassert their powers they

would have to financially withdraw from the subsidies.

Convention advocates say that we could invoke Article V and narrow the scope of the convention. I don't see any provision in our Constitution to do that.

Article V does provide for adding amendments to the Constitution. But once invoked the convention could do away with the constitution completely and impose a new one, effectively changing our entire way of life.

Congress can select the delegates that go to the convention. Once it is handed over to the convention, it is out of the state's hands. Those hand-picked delegates of congress essentially can decide on an entirely new form of government with a new constitution.

James Madison and the other delegates sent under our original constitution ignored their instructions from the States and set aside the old constitution and created the new constitution. A significant amount of our Founding Fathers, known as the Anti-

Federalists, were opposed to a stronger federal government. They felt that government would fester and morph into the same type of corruption and lack of representation that they had just fought a revolution for.

Ultimately, I believe it is more group think, seeking an easy fix to decades of citizens allowing government to run out of control. If we had the wise men of old who put the needs of their fellow mankind ahead of their own, perhaps. If a Constitutional Convention does come to fruition, I pray that reasonable and wise people who are not quick to anger are able to meet and agree on peaceful tenets that ensure the personal sovereignty and unalienable rights are enshrined in a new bill of rights.

REMEMBER THE LADIES

Some of our readers may be old enough to remember Hedy Lamarr, once referred to as "The Most Beautiful Woman In Film." She was the original inspiration for Disney's Snow White, as well as Catwoman in the original Batman comic series. She is considered a rock star at Google and has her own "Google Doodle" celebrating her 101st birthday. Hedy was both a stunningly beautiful actress and brilliant inventor who helped bring us the advanced technology we take for granted today.

Hedy was born November 9th, 1914 in Vienna, Austria to a wealthy Jewish banking family. She began her acting career as a teenager in Germany. In 1933, she married Fritz Mendl, an Austrian munitions dealer associated with the Nazi party. It was during their short four-year marriage that Hedy gained the knowledge of war time weaponry and munitions that would later prove beneficial to the Allied war effort.

In 1940, Hedy met George Antheil, the "Bad Boy of Music", at

a dinner party. Both creators and innovators, Hedy wanted to address the Navy's problems with remote controlled torpedoes. With Hedy as the brains and George as the artist, the two were awarded US Patent No. 2,292,387 for their "Secret Communication System" in August 1942. Based on the functionality of player pianos, their idea involved changing radio frequencies simultaneously to prevent enemies from being able to detect and intercept messages, making torpedoes stealthier. This invention eventually led to GPS, Bluetooth, and Wifi.

Ironically, the Navy rejected the "Frequency Hopping" patent, but later used the tech during the 1960's Cuban Missile Crisis. Hedy, aka "Lady Bluetooth", was never recognized for her achievement until very late in life, nor received any financial compensation.

RESISTANCE

When this happens, government starts to turn on its own citizens. Sadly, the state of affairs that were warned about is upon us. The Republic, a bastion of liberty and instrument that protected our rights, has been actively engaged, for over a year now, in consuming our civil liberties.

Madmen, who believe they are entitled, or thrive on taking advantage of the gullible, have risen to the top. Historically, they are the most ambitious. They typically thrive on complacency and abdication of responsibility. Ultimately the more control they accumulate and wield the more narcissistic they become.

This has led us all down the path to the eventuality and days of reckoning that our Forefathers also had to go through. Some of them came up with a phrase to represent a sentiment about how they felt about the matter.

“Live Free or Die.”

A decent proportion of the Colonies enacted the right of self-determination. The progressive

corruption and tyranny of Great Britain was the gold standard of government in the world. If that was not enough, the British Empire was the most powerful government in the world. How bad must things have been to convince a common farmer to take on that kind of power?



What kind of resistance was there? How did they finally overcome the most powerful government in the world? How much support did the Revolution

really have? More importantly, do the numbers of the past tell us anything of today?

According to ushistory.org there were about 20 percent of the colonists that were classified as loyalists. The website defined the patriots as a small percentage and fence sitters as making up the majority. This is a bit too broad to make any conclusions, so I spent a couple days looking through countless sources. Surprisingly, there was quite a variance in numbers and estimates over the years, but I settled on some numbers that are in line with modern theory.

In my research, I ran across a well thought out article in the Journal of the American Revolution from February 11th, 2013. In his article, 'John Adams's Rule of Thirds', Michael Schellhammer compiles some numbers from a variety of sources. In the statistics presented by historian Robert Calhoun, about 15-20% of the population was loyal to the crown and 40-45% were loyal to the Rebellion. That means that a full third was indifferent and

referred to as fence sitters. These fence sitters tended to support the status quo or the government that benefitted them the most.

But just because a part of a population support something does not mean that it is active in affecting change. A over 100,000 were in the Continental Army. In the Observer on July 3rd, 2017, John A. Tures wrote an article titled 'More Americans Fought in the American Revolution Than We Thought'. This article lays out the evidence that roughly half a million people were in the militia and roughly 350,000 serving at any given time. The population of 1780 was 2,780,369.

With the data above we can attribute military participation on the Colonial side of around six hundred thousand or 4.63%. With those sympathetic to the cause at a conservative estimate of 975,000 or around 35%.

There are at least a third of the country who are a solidly sympathetic to restoring the Republic to its original scope of government, both on a federal and

state scale. That number solidifies more every day that the current corrupt government continues to collapse under the weight of corruption within it. I am not sure that there is five percent of the population willing to affect change in the republic.

Today, instead of loyalists, we get to deal with communists. They along with socialists, anarchists, collectivists, and other extreme left ideologies represent that same %20. That portion leads a fair amount of the democratic and left leaning power structure that consist of about a third of the population.

This assessment leads me to believe that we are not quite at the level necessary to affect change in the government.

If current trends from the Democrat controlled federal government are any indication, the tyranny will continue to escalate at a shocking speed. The chain of affects due to rapid change in federal oppression are likely to rip the wheels off what remains of stability. Every aspect from foreign

policy to economic stability is under threat of collapse.

The lust for power and domination is reaching sick proportions. The normal catalyst for action has not yet built to a fever pitch, so there is a bit more pain before the curtain falls on this act of the play. The period immediately preceding the Revolutionary War was filled with edicts from an arrogant government that was out of touch with the real people in the Colonies.

A series of increasingly oppressive edicts were issued. Each new law was met with a greater portion in defiance. This turned to open rebellion when the government turned to outright violence against the people.

Early this year radical activists from fringe left and right political sides hijacked a liberty rally in support of President Trump at the Capitol in Washington D.C. The radical instigators were successful in leading a small number of unwitting right leaning Trump Supporters in breaking into the Capitol building. None of those

arrested have been shown to have carried any firearms in the restricted area but the lawless tour of one of our nation's symbols of power, is being mischaracterized by the corrupt media and government.

More than a full Division of National Guard from around the country deployed into the Capitol and constructed military fencing with razor wire throughout the area, effectively turning Washington D.C. into a militarized zone. For months the professed hoard of liberty loving patriots, now branded as terrorists, never came to swarm the government buildings and take over.



The heavy-handed response was led by the Military Industrial Complex referred to in President Eisenhower's Farewell Address

given just over sixty years ago on January 17th, 1961. While reading the 'Reading Copy' of the Farewell Address located online in the Eisenhower Library, I came across a section that really stood out to me. The handwritten notes and emphasis also really helped bring the speech alive. Note: I have maintained the spelling and grammar errors from the source that I used.

“CRISES there will continue to be. In meeting them, whether foreign or domestic, great or small, there is a recurring temptation to feel that some spectacular and costly action could become the miraculous solution to all current difficulties.

A huge increase in newer elements of our defense; development of unrealistic programs to cure every ill in agriculture; a dramatic expansion in basic and applied research - - these and many other possibilities, (each possibly promising in itself), may be suggested as the only way to the road we wish to travel.

BUT EACH PROPOSAL must be weighed in the light of a broader consideration: The need to maintain balance in and among national programs - - balance between the private and the public economy; balance between cost and hoped for advantage; balance between the clearly necessary and the comfortably desirable; balance between our essential requirements as a nation and the duties imposed by the nation upon the individual; balance between actions of the moment and the national welfare of the future.

Good judgment seeks balance and progress; lack of it eventually finds imbalance and frustration.”

Sixty years ago, President Eisenhower understood the challenges that were shaping up for our nation. He also understood that the total influence into economic, political, and spiritual aspects, that the massive arms industry has, comes with “grave implications.”

He went on to state that, *“IN THE COUNCILS of government, we must guard against the*

acquisition of unwarranted influence, whether sought or unsought, by the military-industrial complex.

The potential for the disastrous rise of misplaced power exists and will persist.

WE MUST NEVER let the weight of this combination endanger our liberties or democratic processes.

We should take nothing for granted.”

Sixty years later has our, ‘Councils of Government’ defended liberty? It could be argued that government has merely enriched elected representatives, senators, judges, and governors. This has coincided with endless wars across the globe while those that govern bloat their bank accounts with the blood of the patriots who continue to serve the country.

Government continues to violate the tenets of Natural Law to allow the strip mining of American assets. The fabled American Middle Class was obliterated in the brutal

decimation of small businesses. Those companies accounted for most of the commerce heading into the hyped pandemic of 2020.

Blatant and systemic election fraud in several key counties in key battleground states likely swayed the difference in the Presidential Election of 2020. But an Oligarchy is swiftly solidifying power regardless of the will of the people. 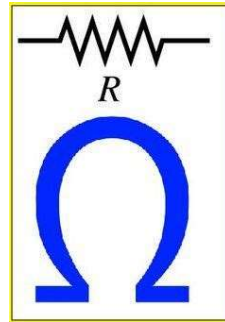

form of government entirely. Delegates from our first government were under instructions not to form a new constitution. We all know how that worked out. Ultimately our first government and constitution were dissolved against the wishes of many prominent Founding Fathers.

Direct action is not warranted at this time. No offense that I can see warrants an attack on life or limb. 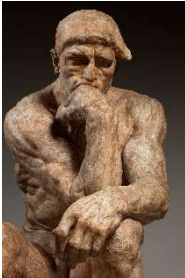

April 1777

April 2nd. Off the coast of Delaware. Frigates HMS Roebuck and HMS Perseus, commanded by Captain Charles Phipps, spotted, and gave chase to the USS Defense. After a brief engagement, the Defense surrendered.

April 13th. General Benjamin Lincoln and his five hundred Colonials were surprised by two thousand Redcoats under the command of General Charles Cornwallis. Amazingly Lincoln masterfully led his men in an orderly retreat that resulted in the loss of only six killed, three cannons captured or destroyed, and twenty prisoners of war.

April 20th. New York adopts their new constitution as a new independent state.

April 21st. Off the coast of South Carolina. Frigate HMS Galatea captured the privateer Francois with a load of salt.

April 25th. Governor William Tryon landed eighteen hundred and fifty men on the Saugatuck

River at a place called Compo Beach. He then marched his troops to the mostly empty Colonial depot in Danbury, Connecticut. Finding that most of the supplies had been moved, he sacked and burned the town to the ground.

April 26th. Sixteen-year-old Sybil Ludington rode forty miles in New York to warn her father's militia of the marching British.

April 27th. General Benedict Arnold met General Gold Sillman and General David Wooster in Redding. All together they had six hundred men. They had heard about the attack at Danbury and rallied against the British. The Colonials were badly mauled. General Wooster lost his life after repeated assaults. General Arnold was nearly captured when he was caught in his stirrups when his horse was shot. An attacking Tory demanded his surrender, but he managed to untangle himself and escape.

April 28th. The English led by General Williams Tryon, maneuvered towards Compo Hill,

near where they would board their ships. General Arnolds men formed up to stop the English from withdrawing but a bayonet charge of four hundred British led by General Erskine scattered the Colonials. The British boarded their ships and sailed off while the Americans licked their wounds.

We got a couple good licks in before we holed up within the deep impenetrably walls. And then the thunder started. We were safe, but the sound and impacts assailed us through ground and air. Drawing the breath we needed for shouting. Eventually there was a rhythm to it.

So in the lessening, men ducked out to give report, shoot a cannon or two, and return.

But some didn't. And as that list grew longer, questions were asked. Why? And as the men sent out for scouting themselves failed to return pairs of men were sent. Of one of the first pairs a single man returned. Like a whirlwind his tale passed through the ranks; of the lost men, working together, to hold up the shattered flagpole, even in death.

The next lull, some men went to look. Fewer returned. Without orders, lottery, or selection; each pause, another man. All through the night.

That flag, it never failed, never fell, never quit, never surrendered.

In the bombardment of Ft. McHenry, from which came the poem "Defense of Ft M'Henry" most people now know as the song "The Star-Spangled Banner", a sign the flag had lowered meant the fort had surrendered. Hundreds of men gave up their lives to ensure the enemy did not see it lowered, after the enemy targeted the flag

and shot the flagpole down. Man by man they went out to hold it up with their dying arms. There is no greater courage I can think of than that action. Nor men who have achieved a greater level of honor. Men of all types performed the deed from enlisted to officer, cook to soldier. Servants, freed slaves, boys, and men. They took an oath and stood against truly insurmountable odds in defense of our country.

Too many today would mock and ridicule them. Myself, I stand in awe of them.

Chicken on a String

You hang it on a string over the fire and the chicken will turn itself. (It's a good idea if you bind your chicken here and there to stop it crumbling off the carcass)
