The Soul of a Nation

William Prescott at Bunker Hill

In reflection upon the people of Colonial America, so far as I have come to understand them, I find that there was a collective soul of this Nation of Liberty before it existed. What I mean to try to explain is that there was a point where the corruption, absurdity, and outright tyrannical oppression grew exponentially to cause the opposition to spontaneously materialize out of former loyal subjects. Put simply, there was a point where enough was enough.

Good common everyday people were forced into acts of desperation and self-preservation.

Looking at the individual colonies that became the United States of America, it is a miracle that they managed to form a union. All the colonies were different in key fundamental ways, yet the oppression by an out-of-control government led by an incompetent and clueless king became too much to bear.

When the mandates, edicts, taxes, restrictions, and administrative laws began to strip the public of their liberties (all in the name of common good of course), the Colonists unified out of shared grievances.

A simplified history lesson may help us understand the rapid devolution into open rebellion. King George III came to power at the young age of twenty-two. His lack of experience and overreliance on advice from John Stuart, his childhood mentor, and Earl of Bute, caused him to make several large blunders that unleashed a wave of corruption.

King George III shook up the Church of England by breaking the

hold of the latitudinarian moderates. That is to say that the tolerance of the Puritans and those breakaway sects that wanted to be free from the Church of England was coming to an end. This came at a time when the King had broken the Whig supremacy in government and favored the disaffected Tories.

The King believed that the moves along with supporting his childhood teacher would solidify his power. Instead, John Stuarts government lasted less than a year and a string of successive failed governments finally led the king to solve the problem by refusing to allow Lord North to resign once he took the position in 1770. For the next 12 years Lord north wrote an annual resignation and the King rejected it.

This was the condition of the British empire as corruption and tyranny became unbearable. The colonists sent emissaries and representatives to seek redress. When repeated attempts were rebuffed and protests grew the king lashed out in oppressive acts to subjugate the populace. Yet the good people rallied round one

another and when they needed help, they were there for each other.

In August of 1774, William Prescott led the men of Pepperell, Massachusetts, to deliver many loads of rye, telling Boston's inhabitants:

"We heartily sympathize with you, and are always ready to do all in our power for your support, comfort and relief; knowing that Providence has placed you where you must stand the first shock.

We consider we are all embarked in (the same ship) and must sink or swim together...

If we submit to these regulations, all is gone.

Our forefathers passed the vast Atlantic, spent their blood and treasure, that they might enjoy their liberties, both civil and religious, and transmit them to their posterity...

Now if we should give them up, can our children rise up and call us blessed?...

Let us all be of one heart, and stand fast in the liberty wherewith Christ has made us free; and may

he, of his infinite mercy grant us deliverance out of all our troubles.”

The oppressed free spirits of the colonies had enough when the military was turned against them. There was no choice at that point yet dreams and hopes of reconciliation or at least a short conflict was on the hearts and minds of most people.

The people of the United States had attempted reconciliation and representation all the way up until the declaration of Independence. Liberty or death was more than a catchy phrase, it was reality for those who stood on the side of freedom. But let us always remember that they were peacemakers long before they were forced into utilizing the Natural Right of self-defense. At that point they had to go all in.

The corruption, oppression, and eventual outright tyranny that the colonies experienced was a culmination of an eventual process that had already been underway for several hundred years.

Great Britain had spent vast amounts of treasure and resources that had financed wars, exploration,

and conquest throughout the age of exploration and enlightenment debts and the increasing interest on that debt kept compounding. After the French and Indian War, England had little choice but to roll out taxes to pay for the overexuberance.

The incompetence of the king's administration combined with the corruption and greed of Parliament, ensured that any programs would fail under the bureaucracy that had taken hold.

History is not just something that happened. It can clearly tell us the rhythms and patterns that come and go with the endless cycle of corruption and renewal of government. Perhaps it is time we look at what it reflects upon our own timeline.

There's a famous maxim used in the network news business: "If it bleeds, it leads." Human beings are hardwired to notice the negative in our environment. Negativity bias helped us to survive and thrive in challenging environments. Headlines and news narratives are deliberately designed to trigger our most powerful negative emotions—disgust, anger and fear. Psychologically, it's hard for us to look away from things that trigger these emotions. And if we don't look away, the news network can make more money, and can have more influence over society.

The science of manipulating entire societies, has been developed and used to control

political narratives and consolidate power for a long time. The chaos we see in the world today is the result of a simple manipulative playbook: “Be afraid, be very afraid.”

Once you understand you’re probably being manipulated with fear, you’re going to start seeing this playbook everywhere. The goal of the playbook is to create a world government with power consolidated in the hands of a few, who have total power over everyone else.

Let’s look at just three of the “Be Afraid” narratives that have been activated and are currently being used to manipulate you into giving up your freedom, liberty and God-given rights: overpopulation, global warming, and the Covid Crisis.

In the 1970’s, Paul Ehrlich published “The Population Bomb”. In this book, Ehrlich claimed “the battle to feed all of humanity is over.” Ehrlich’s book argued that many of the day’s most alarming events had a single, underlying cause: too many people, taking too much from the earth. starvation” on “a dying planet.” The book made population control an acceptable topic of discussion for modern governments. Today’s world leaders who are pushing Agenda 21 and the New World Order still promote the idea that there are too many people.

However, mass starvation never happened. Instead, new technologies for equipment, agriculture, seeds and farming methods were developed that increased both the nutritional value of crops as well as the total yield per acre. Today’s farms are modern miracles of abundance. When the supply chains are not hindered by government interference, our stores are overflowing with fresh food from all over the world.

In 2006, former Vice-President Al Gore released a documentary titled “An Inconvenient Truth”. Gore claimed, “unless drastic measures to reduce greenhouse gases are taken within the next 10 years, the world will reach a point of no return.” However, Gore’s terrible predictions failed to materialize. Our Reflection of History

January 1778

January of 1778 was a busy time in winter quarters. There are no historical records that we could locate to show any battles, scrimmages, or naval engagements.

Perhaps it was best that there was no fighting against the Redcoats, as the Continental Army had suffered through a rough end to the year. The Struggle against the elements was proving to be equally challenging.

The capitol of Philadelphia had been lost and Washington had been defeated in his attempt to seize the initiative at Germantown. His troops had fared no better at White Marsh, and the vision of the last hungry cold winter crept into the minds of the soldiers who still had time on their enlistments.

At the onset of winter things were looking to be as ill provisioned as

the year before. Yet Washington spent the winter lobbying for funds, provisions, and supplies. He ordered the forces that he had assembled to move towards a long-term structure that supplied and provided for the needs of the Army.

The Army at Valley Forge constructed over two thousand log huts in preparation. This significant improvement helped moral to recover during the later parts of the winter as more clothing, food, and resources were sourced for the encampment.

The newly constructed bridge across the Schuylkill River enabled an efficient resupply line and provisions were adequate at times. The core medical, engineering, and provisioning assets of the military were starting to come together after nearly three years of fighting what was initially believed to be a short-term scrimmage.

Firecake and *Pepper Pot Soup* were primary staples among the troops. General Washington was successful in convincing congress to provide funds for the food and clothing that was to be distributed to the Army. The effects of this

focused effort to improve the infrastructure in the Army were just starting to be realized in January. Still the twelve-thousand-person camp lost nearly two thousand souls during the six months they would spend in winter quarters between 1777-1778. It was only after General Washington warned Congress that the Army would either “starve, dissolve, or disperse”, that Congress acted. I suppose some things never change.



While the military action was lacking during the month of January there was a document that caught my eye that I felt compelled to share the beginning portion of here. While publishing constraints limit me in publishing the whole exchange, this letter from Major General Nathanael Greene to General George Washington highlights a couple of things. First that the institution of slavery that

was forced upon the Americas was one that was a major cause in the rebellion. This is something that the Marxists don't want you to know as they peddle their false 1619 history project.

The second thing that stood out to me was that in the early years of the war there was a keen sense that reconciliation would happen, and they conducted the war in half measures up to that point unwilling to commit to the prospect of a long term endeavor.

Sir,

The commencement of the American war was so singular—it's duration so uncertain—the hopes of reconciliation so strong, that our defence began, and has been continued rather by temporary expedients, than from any proper and fixed establishment.

In the early stages of the dispute, the novelty of war was so great—the spirit of patriotism so high, and the abhorrence of slavery such that the people flew to arms regardless of their families, fortunes and

pleasures which they were about to give up, to engage in the service of their Country. Every body expected a short and speedy issue to the unhappy dispute, and every one felt a perfect freedom to make the necessary sacrifices to bring about a proper reconciliation; that the basis of our future freedom might be so grounded as to admit of no more political shocks: with these flattering hopes the Army struggled through the first campaign and necessity obliged them to persevere in the second. The third has been prosecuted upon an establishment laid in the second, and altho it made more ample provision for the Officers than had been before, yet it is found to be very unsatisfactory. The duty as Citizens—the glow of patriotism and the honors of the field are found insufficient to bind people to a service, that subjects them to a loss of fortune, to give up all the pleasures of domestick life and engages them in a hazardous & fatiguing line of duty, with but very few of the common comforts of life. However melancholy the consideration, it is a serious truth, that there is a greater disinclination

to the service at the close of this Campaign, than has ever been discovered before—it is true the campaign has been severe, but not more so than may be expected while the war continues—People begin to think coolly, they compare their condition in the field with that at home—the situation of their families, & their future prospects grow into objects of importance. to return into private life with a ruined fortune—with a broken constitution, after years of hard servitude—there to sink into neglect & almost contempt, are comfortless considerations to every mind that looks forward to the natural consequences that will result at the termination of this war. I believe Sir, the Officers of this army begin to view their situation in this light, they cannot conceive themselves bound by any ties either private or publick, that oblige them to continue in a service that makes a certain sacrifice of a few, for the common benefit of the rest of the Society—they cannot conceive either the justice or policy of this measure; every Officer sais he is willing to bear a part of the common burden, but a very few

have resolution enough to engage under such a hopeless prospect as the present institution exhibits to the view of every one in the service.

It signifies nothing Sir, to complain of the decay of private or public virtue, or to tax the Americans with the want of spirit and resolution to combat difficulties. The only enquiry that is necessary, is to find whether the war can be prosecuted upon the present establishment, if not, what other can be substituted to remedy the present evils complained of.

The foundation of American liberty would be more sure, & the superstructure with far less difficulty erected, if the love of ease, pleasure and wealth were not so predominant—but these are the materials, and with these the Pile must be erected or not at all.

It is unnecessary to search out the causes of these evils, it is sufficient to satisfy ourselves that they do really exist—to find the remedy is the only necessary enquiry—to fix upon some plan that will be satisfactory to the Officers, and the

least expensive to the public, will be our true interest & national policy.

Experience shews us in many instances that men are often more influenced by a certain & durable support, than by a more liberal provision of a short & uncertain duration; Gentlemen who have a certain character and appearance to maintain—through life, will feel themselves tolerably easy, when there is such a provision made that with the strictest oeconomy they can support themselves, maintain their character, preserve their dignity & standing in Society...”

Excerpt from a letter written in January 1778 by Major General Nathanael Greene to General George Washington. The entire letter can be located at the National Archives.

One of the things that captivates me as I look through the countless letters of our ancestors and founding fathers is that we can glean so much from personal correspondence about little known facts of the day.

One last item of note that happened in January of 1778. Captain James Cook became the first European explorer to discover the Hawaiian Islands. They were named the Sandwich Islands by Cook, after the Earl of Sandwich. While the Hawaiian Islands retained their native name, we still eat sandwiches, which were created so that the distinguished Earl could have a food that he could eat while playing cards. Life was pretty good for the deep state, even back then.

Patriot Reflection

This editions reflection comes from Poems Written and Published During the American Revolutionary War, by Philip Freneau and published by Lydia R. Bailey in 1809 at Philadelphia. The text and it's references has been preserved from page 204 of the book and we present it to you below.

TO THE AMERICANS ,

ON THE

RUMOURED APPROACH OF
THE HESSIAN FORCES ,
WALDECKERS , & c .
(PUBLISHED 1775.)

The blast of death ! the infernal
guns prepare 6 Rise with the storm
and all its dangers share . "

OCCASIONED BY GENERAL
GAGES ' PROCLAMATION
THAT THE PROVINCES
WERE IN A ' STATE OF RE
BELLION , AND OUT OF THE
KING'S PROTECTION .

REBELS you are the British
champion cries TRUTH , stand
thou forth ! -and tell the wretch , He

lies -

Rebels ! —and see this mock
imperial lord Already threatens these
rebels with the CORD . *

The hour draws nigh , the glass is
almost run , When truth will shine
, and ruffians be undone ; When
this base miscreant will forbear to
sneer , And curse his taunts , and
bitter insults , here .

If to controul the cunning of a
knave , Freedom respect , and
scorn the name of SLAVE ; If to
protest against a tyrant's laws , And
arm for vengeance in a righteous
cause Be deemed REBELLION - '
tis a harmless thing : This bug - bear
name , like death , has lost its sting

,
AMERICANS ! at freedom's fane
adore ! But trust to Britain , and her
flag , no more : The generous
genius of their isle has fled , And
left a mere impostor in his stead .

If conquered , rebels (their Scotch
records show) Receive no mercy
from the parent foet Nay , even the
grave , that friendly haunt of peace

, (Where nature gives the woes of
man to cease)

Vengeance will search - and buried
corpses there Be raised , to feast
the vultures of the air Be hanged on
gibbets ! -such a war they wagem
Such are the devils that swell our
souls with rage !

If Britain conquers , help us ,
heaven , to fly : Lend us your wings
, ye ravens of the sky ; If Britain
conquers , we exist no more ;
These lands will redden with their
children's gore , Who , turned to
slaves , their fruitless toils will moan
, Toils in these fields , that once
they called their own !

To arms ! to arms -and let the
murdering sword Decide , who best
deserves the HANGMAN'S
CORD : Nor think the hills of
Canada too bleak When desperate
freedom is the prize you seek ; For
that , the call of honour bids you go
O'er frozen lakes , and mountains

Physical fitness is the largest deficiency in our global world of ease. As we get older the difficult tasks of homesteading can be made more difficult if we spend too much time watching YouTube videos about doing the things that we should be doing right now. Action with the ability to figure things out are traits that are learned and need to be exercised. What will you do when the internet goes down?

Basic skills in our home are supplemented with books on skills we know that we will need to acquire when technology is no longer available. We slowly attempt to integrate more self sufficiency into our lives as we go along and hard copy written materials are highly valued in our home.

Tools and gadgets make the task of providing enough calories for you and your family, a little bit more achievable. But if you don't have the knowledge or materials to maintain those tools they will quickly become unserviceable.

Faith in a higher power is paramount to surviving what is coming. You can't overcome this on your own. In addition to that faith ensure that you include a functioning moral compass and work on improving your mental health and fortitude.

First things first, how are you going to wash your food and prepare a meal in sanitary conditions? If your water comes from a source that requires any sort of electricity or electric circuit, you may not have access to running water.

Speaking of water, do you have the means to source it and filter it if necessary? How much can you safely store at home if you cannot leave due to a long-term event?

How are you going to heat up food and cook it properly to avoid food born illness? Propane camp stoves are a lifeline of time until you run out of fuel. By then a more permanent solution will need to be implemented.

If all of your cold storage was instantly wiped out your neighbors would probably enjoy a very nice

festive barbeque, after that, then what?

Without stores and any resupply within the immediate future what is your plan to grow, raise, fish, and hunt for food? How much experience do you have, and do you have all the required tools to support your homestead?

Instead of buying a softer toilet seat consider an investment in a shovel and outhouse plans, just in case. If you live in the city, I strongly recommend you get out while you still can. If you are new in your rural community, I strongly recommend you get out and start shaking hands. The neighbor behind you or across the way may save you or your families life if robbers or gangs come against you in the future.
